# Tomato Varieties

**Determinant:** Determinate tomatoes are varieties that grow to a fixed mature size and ripen all their fruit in a short period. Once this first flush of fruit has ripened, the plant will begin to diminish in vigor and will set little to no new fruit.

**Indeterminant:** Indeterminate tomatoes are vining plants that continue to extend in length throughout the growing season until frost kills the plant.

## Amelia

Fruit size: 8 to 10 ounces

Determinate

Amelia is a hybrid with outstanding disease resistance and resistance to cracking. Because it makes a nice, neat plant, Amelia is cooperative in containers, too. One of the few tomatoes resistant to spotted wilt virus.

## Arkansas Traveler (Heirloom)

Fruit Size: 6 to 8 ounces

Indeterminate

Arkansas Traveler produces goodly numbers of rich flavorful tomatoes. Deep pink when ripe, it is the balance of sweetness and tartness accounts for its standing as one of the very best varieties.

## BHN-589

Fruit Size: 8 to 10 ounces

Determinate

BHN-589 offers a surprising combination of fruit quality, shelf life, and really good flavor. It also boasts a complete disease-resistance package including crack-tolerance and offers very high yields. Large to extra-large attractive fruit have real tomato taste.

## Celebrity \*County Favorite\*

Fruit size: 7 to 8 ounces

Determinate

Celebrity vines bear clusters of large tomatoes that are prized for their flavor. This is a great, all-round, dependable choice for your "basic" tomato needs — sandwiches, slicing, snacks, and bruschetta

## Cherokee Carbon (Heirloom)

Fruit Size: 12 to 15 ounces

Indeterminate

A gorgeous dusky purple beefsteak with rich, complex flavor, this hybrid is a cross between two heirloom taste-test winners, Cherokee Purple and Carbon. Makes one of the most delicious tomato sandwiches you'll ever taste!

## Genuwine (Heirloom)

Fruit size: 10.5 – 11.5 ounces

Indeterminate

Genuwine is an Heirloom Marriage tomato, selected for the best attributes of old and new. These fruits are smooth, unblemished, and anywhere from 10.5 to 11.5 ounces on average -- just the right size for slicing onto sandwiches and into salads!

## Homestead (Old World Variety)

Fruit size: 8 – 9 ounces

Determinate

An old favorite dating from 1954. Developed by the University of Florida especially for hot climates and known for its reliability to set fruit at high temperatures. Produces firm, meaty tomatoes. Large vines help shade fruit to protect from sunburn and will need to be staked or caged.

## Large Cherry

Fruit size: 1 to 2 ounces

Indeterminate

Cherry Tomatoes are equally famous for being easy to grow and tasting delicious! The plant produces abundant clusters of smallish, vibrant colored fruit.

## Lemon Boy (Yellow Acidless Variety)

Fruit size: 7 ounces

Indeterminate

Lemon Boy hybrid is an eye-catching tomato with wonderful color and flavor. The deep globe fruit is slightly tangy, but also sweet and mild, meaty, and smooth — perfect for slicing.

## Mountain Pride

Fruit size: 6 to 8 ounces

Determinate

F1 Hybrid is a deep red, crack resistant tomato with firm flavorful flesh. Excellent choice for Home Gardens and Market Growers. They're a nice size for slicing and the perfect combo of sweet/tart.

## Porter

Fruit size: 2 to 4 ounces

Indeterminant

The 'Porter' tomato was developed in and for Texas weather. It produces well, setting fruit even in dry, hot climates. Its fruit are ovate (egg-shaped), dark pink in color, about an inch and a half long and weigh two to four ounces. Its good, complex taste makes it a favorite for eating fresh or canning and juicing.

## Roma

Fruit size: 3 inches long

Determinate

Roma produces a large harvest of thick-walled, meaty, bright red, egg-shaped tomatoes about 3 inches long and with few seeds. This tomato is not juicy. This is not a slicing tomato. Instead, the flesh is thick and drier so that it will cook down into a thick sauce.

## \*NEW\* Sugar Plum

Fruit size: ½ to ¾ ounces

Indeterminate

Rated best tasting grape tomato - very sweet and flavorful! Firm fruits form in long clusters which allow for an easy harvest. Vining plants requires stakes or cages. Perfect for salads and snacks. Excellent choice for Home Gardens.
